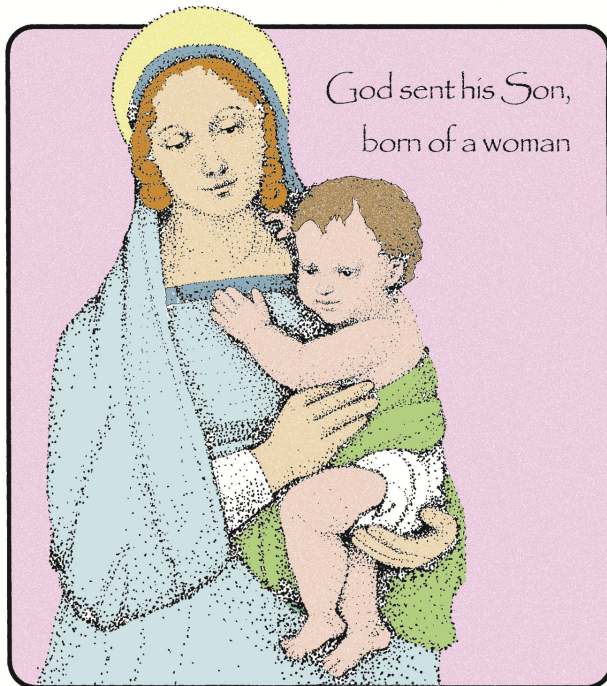

TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE

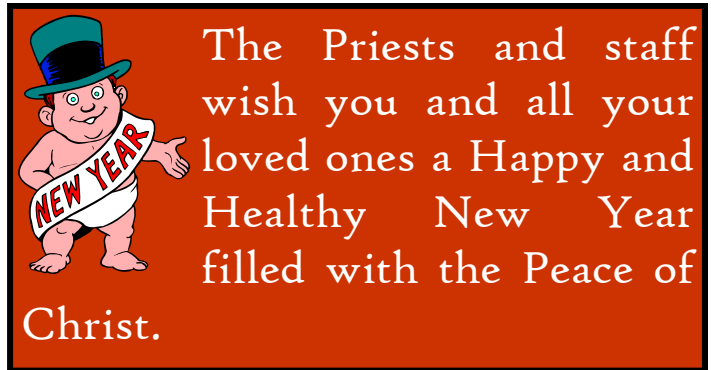
“The Blessed Mother of God”

When Adam turned his back on God and was thrown out of Paradise, God did not leave him and Eve to their own devices. He gave them a second chance. He said to the serpent, “I will put enmity between you and a woman, between your offspring and hers. She will crush your head. Genesis 3:15

Thus began the rehabilitation of fallen humanity. God promised that a woman would come who would overcome Satan. She would not do it of herself, but through “her offspring”. At the appointed time the chosen woman, Mary, conceived a son by the power of the Holy Spirit and gave birth to Jesus who was true God and true man. She brought God into our world in human form. She truly became the Mother of God. Today, eight days after the Nativity, we honor Mary as Mother of God. The Church, through the centuries, has given Mary many titles-check the Litany of the Blessed Mother. None of those titles can add anything to Mary’s original title, Mother of God, although they may portray aspects of her life.

Whatever honor or place Mary has in our Faith, it is all because of her unique role and mission to give the world a Savior—to bring God among us in human form. Today we should honor her as Mother since she is our mother given to us by Jesus as He hung dying on the cross. We should also respond to her as Mother by emulating her example and doing as she did. When God invited her to be Mother of the Savior, her response was “Let it be done to me according to Your word”; i.e. I will do as the Lord wants. No doubt, each of us would want to honor our earthly mother by doing what pleases her, by obeying her advice and by following her example. Mary, is in truth, our mother also and we owe her no less honor or obedience.

Perhaps today we might do some serious reflection on Mary, her life and her response to God and decide that in this New Year we will strive harder to follow the example that she has given us. We should always strive to do God’s Will as Mary did. On this special day as we begin a new year, we might also resolve to model our lives on her and also decide that each day of this new year we will strive to promote devotion to Mary and create respect for all mothers.

FROM THE DEACON'S DEN

Apostolic is the last characteristic of the Church in the Creed. "The Church is apostolic because she is founded on the apostles, in three ways: built on "the foundation of the Apostles," the witnesses chosen and sent on mission by Christ himself; with the help of the Spirit dwelling in her, the Church keeps and hands on the teaching, the "good deposit," the salutary words she has heard from the apostles; she continues to be taught, sanctified, and guided by the apostles until Christ's return, through their successors in pastoral office: the college of bishops." (CC 857) Jesus was sent to us as the "Father's Emissary" and the Apostles became Jesus' emissaries on Pentecost. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) The Pope, along with the Bishops, received the responsibility to guide the Church directly from Christ: "he who receives you receives me." (CC 858) So, what does this mean for us in practical terms? In faith our first assumption should be that whatever the Pope and Bishops teach us, it is **Truth!** (Yes, during our 2000 year pilgrimage, there have been mistakes in certain teachings, but not in defined dogma!) The fact that the Pope and Bishops do have this authority is why many Protestants, especially pastors, become Catholics (Certainly this is one of the main reasons for my becoming Catholic!) If you struggle with this key area, I will be glad to help. Let me know if you would like a list of all the scriptures that support Peter as our first Pope.

Deacon Pat will summarize the Bible study on Revelation on January 4th in Room B after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and again at 7:00 p.m. in the evening. Each session will be 2 hr. These sessions are **open to all** and will be helpful to anyone, even if you did not attend the study! 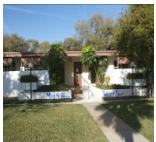
