Matt. 28:6

He had come to help humankind live as The Creator intended in harmony with one another and with God. He became the victim of human jealousy and enmity. But evil would not have the last word in His story. Although He was maligned and rejected by many and the authorities contrived to get rid of Him, He arose in triumph. He overcame the scourging, the carrying of the heavy cross and the pain of being nailed to it for three hours. On Easter Sunday the tomb was empty. Death could not hold Him. OUR EASTER DUTY

Easter is the greatest feast of the Christian year. St. John Chrysostom called Easter the “Feast of Feasts.” Whereas Lenten fasting takes 40 days, Easter feasting takes a full 50 days. What does it mean to feast? Feasting is not just about what we eat, although there are many wonderful foods associated with the Easter feast. Feasts are to be observed with rejoicing. It is our religious duty to feast, that is, to rejoice during the holy days of Easter time as surely as fasting is our religious duty during Lent.

How many of us know how to feast for a day, let along 50 days? Here are a few suggestions on how to keep the joy of Easter alive at your table for the next 50 days.

- Sunday is called a “Little Easter.” Commit to having special dinners on the Sundays of Easter time. Decorate the table with flowers and serve lots of favorites!
- Send a dinner invitation to neighbors, friends, or anyone who may be single, widowed or otherwise alone during the Easter feasting.
- Above all, keep the joy growing by sharing it. Help a neighbor with chores. Offer to clean up trash at your church. Give to Catholic Relief Services so others may be nourished.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Eucharist: Food for Resurrection

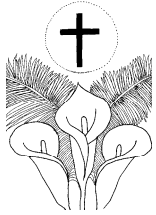
How do we celebrate Easter, the greatest of our Christian feasts? By doing what we do every Sunday and every day: celebrating the Mass. On the first Easter, as the heartbroken disciples walked the road to Emmaus, the Lord was with them but they did not realize it. They only recognized Him “in the breaking of the bread” (Luke 22:35).

It is the same for us. In the Mass—the breaking of the bread—we meet the risen Lord together. We meet Him in each other—for by our baptism into His death and resurrection, we have become members of one body, the Body of Christ. We meet Him in His word—in the liturgy the scriptures are proclaimed to us, that they might take root and grow in us. And we meet Him in a special way in the Eucharist, the sacrament of His Body and Blood, which is food for resurrection: “whoever eats this bread will live forever” (John 6:51). The Lord is Risen indeed, and it is the Risen One who truly presides at this and every Eucharist.

### FROM THE DEACON'S DEN

Like many of you (if not most) I enjoy watching movies just for their entertainment value. More often than not, it is very difficult to find a movie with any “substance” or character development. Even worse there is a lot of gratuitous violence and sex, and I find it very difficult to find wholesome movies like some of the classics available in the past. One movie I found very moving was “The Passion of the Christ (2004)”. I identified with Mary and was struck by the scene where she can hear Jesus being scourged. How horrible she must have felt! I picture her wanting to run and comfort Him, while at the same time wanting to run away because she can really do nothing for Him. For me this is an example of how movies and the media can move us towards God and be a positive influence. Yet, most of the movies in our culture are not a positive influence or promoting the “Good.” Having raised 7 children, I know how difficult this area can be for parents with teens. It requires diligence and perseverance. So in the season of Lent think about watching a truly inspiring film with your children, and take time to discuss the film with your children. If you have older children who have not seen “The Passion of Christ”, you might want to watch it as a family. Be warned though there are some brutal scenes that some people will find very difficult to watch. Here are some web sites you might find helpful. I am not endorsing the films on their lists but I think they are a starting point. In my experience every child is unique and what is appropriate for one child, is not for another even if the same age.
