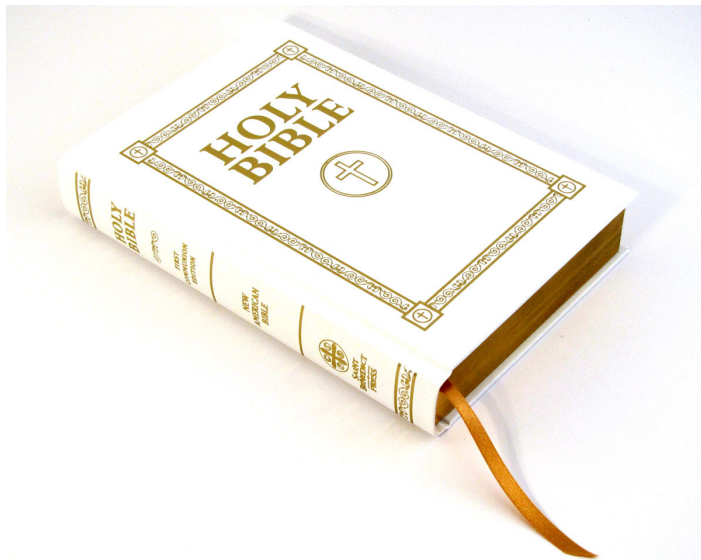

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

"Jesus in the Eucharist"

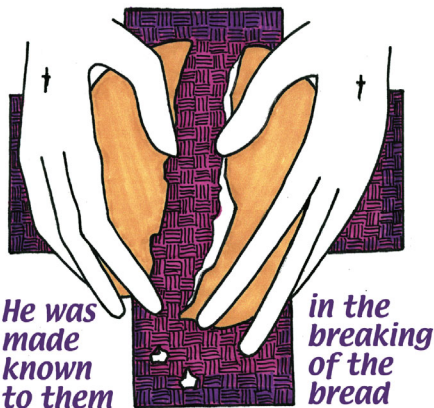
"He was made known to them in the breaking of bread."

The road to Emmaus was a lonely road for the two disciples on that Easter day. They had walked that road many times before and frequently in the company of Christ. Then it was

a pleasant journey as they listened to Christ explain the mysteries of the Kingdom of God and of life itself. Then they had great hopes of a new kingdom where people would enjoy true freedom and plenty. But now it was a lonely road and they had a sense of depression. Jesus, in whom they put their hope, had been taken from them, cruelly treated and died on a cross. They were escaping from the scene of such bad memories of three days earlier. Down hearted and dejected, they trudged along when suddenly a stranger joined them. He inquired about the cause of their dejection. They told Him of the death of Jesus. He then explained all the prophecies about Him and told them that it was part of God's plan that Jesus should suffer before He entered into His glory.

He joined them for dinner and they recognized Him when He broke bread. He had done this before, at the Last supper. The "breaking of bread" was not just the usual matter of sharing a loaf when they were hungry. It had taken on a new meaning. At the Last Supper, He changed bread into His body. They remembered what He did then and recognized Him.

We share in "the breaking of bread" every time we join in celebrating the Eucharist. We know He is present. We believe that. Today we might ask ourselves do we feel as the apostles did, as we celebrate the Eucharist. They said "Were not our hearts burning within us as He talked to us?" "Do we have the fervor that we should have as Christ comes to us in Communion? Do we have the reverence we owe to Christ as He becomes present on the altar during the Consecration? Today, let us pray for a deeper Faith in the Real Presence. May that Faith help us to make Christ present in all our daily activities and in all our relationships. May we walk the Road to Emmaus each day.

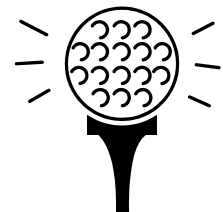

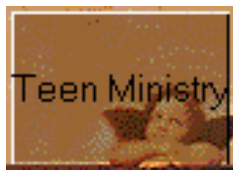

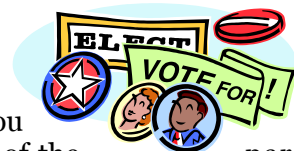
