TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

“THE REAL PRESENCE”

“Whoever eats this bread will live forever.”  
John 6:58

Jesus was speaking to His apostles about giving them His flesh to eat, as St. John records in his gospel. He had told them, “Unless you eat My Flesh and drink My Blood, you cannot have Life in you.” The people “murmured about this” and said how can anyone do this? Jesus simply reiterated what He had said confirming that He would give them and us His Flesh and Blood.

As He ate His farewell supper with His apostles, He took Bread and Wine and said, “This is My Body which is given for you; This is My Blood of the New and Everlasting covenant. Do this in remembrance of Me.”

After He was crucified and had risen, the apostles did as He commanded them. They met for a meal, sung their religious songs, blessed the bread and wine using the words that Jesus had used. They believed that Jesus was present in the Bread and Wine. The church has done it ever since and teaches us that when we celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus becomes present in the Bread and Wine.

On Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) Sunday, the church focuses on the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We are called to faith in the presence of Christ in what appears to be Bread and Wine. Beneath the appearances the church teaches us that Jesus is present. We believe that as one of the central mysteries of our religion.

How do we respond to that divine presence? First, we should receive Christ in the Eucharist frequently, at least each Sunday and if possible during the week. We should do our very best to be devoutly prepared to receive Him in Communion; that means that we must be in the state of grace, i.e. not conscious of any personal sin in our life. After Communion we should spend some time in deep personal communion with Christ, praising Him and thanking Him for coming to us. Secondly, we should spend some time adoring Christ in the Eucharist. We are very blessed to have the Adoration Chapel here where people are present 24 hours every day adoring Christ and asking His intercession. We encourage you to spend some time in adoration each week. It will bring many Blessings to you and to our world.

ST. PETER AND PAUL

June 29th is the Feast of St. Peter and Paul. They are, perhaps, the 2 most prominent Saints in the church. Why don't we give each a feast day of his own? Tradition tells us that Peter and Paul were martyred together in Rome and June 29th is the date we commemorate their martyrdom and entry into heaven. Both were giants in establishing the Christian faith in its beginning. St. Peter was recognized by the Apostles as the leader of the group. He traveled all over the Roman Empire preaching the message of Christ. He endured many hardships and sufferings and eventually was killed because of his preaching in the name of Jesus. He established the Christian Church in Rome, which would become the center of the Christian Church.

St. Paul was a convert to the faith through a mystical experience he had on the road to Damascus as he went to persecute and kill Christ's followers there. Once he became Christian, he traveled all over suffering much opposition, hostility, prison and pain. Eventually he was killed in Rome because of his preaching. He wrote 14 of the Epistles in the Bible. He is regarded as the Patron of Evangelization. May we all follow the example of St. Peter and Paul as we live our faith and witness to Christ.

## FROM THE DEACON'S DEN

Last Sunday we celebrated the Mystery of the Trinity and this Sunday we celebrate another Mystery, the "Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ." You might ask why we have this Solemnity considering the fact that every Mass is a celebration of the Eucharist. The feast was instituted in 1264 to counteract the belief by many that it was not really the Body and Blood of Christ, a problem that still exists today. According to a Gallup poll in 1992, only 30% of those surveyed believe they are actually receiving the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread and wine. Of course we could ask if the 70% who didn't accept this Truth of our Faith attended Mass on a regular basis, but this data highlights the importance of this Solemnity! [53](#) Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." [60](#) Then many of his disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" [61](#) Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? (John 6) Obviously the disciples understood the significance of what Jesus said and that He wasn't saying the Body and Blood are just symbols! St. Paul emphasizes this: "Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself" (1 Corinthians 11:28). So, each of us should ask if we are receiving the Body and Blood of Christ worthily: we must not be guilty of mortal sin, we must believe it truly is the Body and Blood of Christ, and we must be in union with the Church. I would also suggest that how we participate in the Mass can help others to see that we are participating in a profound Mystery. Ask yourself, "Is there is more I can do to emphasize this Mystery? Does my participation reflect the Awe and Reverence I should demonstrate?" I would encourage everyone to read the Catechism, 1322-1419. "The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend." In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, *the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained.*" "This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a *substantial* presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present." (CC1374)'

## RCIA



**Should our faith change throughout adult life? Most adults say, "Yes."** In Rev. Richard J. Sweeny's Catholic Update article *How God Invites Us to Grow: Six stages of Faith Development* we learn the answers to these questions.

**4. Personal Faith:** A desire to take personal responsibility for the beliefs I hold and the values I live by points to a more personal (though not private!) faith less dependent upon group expectations. My understanding of God is now increasingly shaped by my personal life experience. Former beliefs are examined and may be altered, renewed, deepened or, if found faulty, discarded altogether.

The passage to a personally "owned" faith rarely occurs without significant tension and struggle. St. Teresa of Avila found her own journey from a conventional to a more personal faith to be a wrenching experience. In describing this experience she wrote, "I have sometimes been terribly oppressed by this turmoil of thoughts." She noted wisely that at that point the presence of doubts and questions may lead persons to feel that they are losing their faith.

The opposite is often true. God may be leading them to probe the deeper meaning of their previous faith. Faith-filled living now means accepting that even the most helpful laws, norms and guidelines are sometimes limited in their ability to point out the best behavior. Reliance upon a God who is ever-loving and who has blessed us with the gift of human reason now makes it possible for persons to act increasingly according to their own most honest judgments and decisions..
