TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

**"THE SEED, GOD'S WORD"**

"A sower went out to sow his seed."  
Matt 13:3

Each Spring the farmer goes out with his supply of seed and corn drill to plant corn. He is full of hope that his planting will produce a bountiful harvest. He also knows that some of his seed will not grow because the crows enjoy it, or drought parches it or chicken weed

chokes it. But harvest comes and he has a bumper harvest.

The seed sown is the Word of God. His Word, proclaimed from Scripture, is sown in the hearts of multitudes of people in varying ways. What will His seed produce? It will produce abundantly or poorly depending on where the seed falls. The seed may settle in a generous heart, be gratefully received and produce an abundance of good works. Or, it may fall in the heart of a lukewarm person and produce very little. God still sends forth His Word into our hearts. How it changes our life and what good it produces, depends on how we accept it and how generously we respond to it.

The Church has been encouraging us, since Vatican II (1965), to read the Bible. Thank God we read our Bibles more than we used to. We should ask ourselves are we applying the Word of God to our lives? Are we doing it in such a way that it affects our lives and draws us closer to Christ? When Christ talked about giving Himself to His followers, many walked away. Christ said to the others, "Will you also go away?" They responded, "To whom shall we go, Lord, You have the words of everlasting life." His Word gives eternal life and makes life in this world much more

## FROM THE DEACON

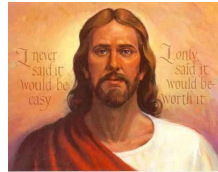
*"But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear."* (Matt. 13:16) The Parable of

the Sower, this Sunday's readings, applies to all the baptized, although the ultimate understanding must be consistent with the Magisterium. Each of us can look at this from the perspective of the "sower," or that of the "ground". Am I sowing "good seed" by my actions and by what I say as I go about my daily activities? Even if you are in an environment that is "rocky" or "thorny" some of the seed may take root. Some seed may be dormant and not sprout for some time in the future and you may not see the results, but that should not matter to us as long as we continue to plant "good seed". It is the job of the Holy Spirit to bring "seeds" to fruition. However, you do need to have "seed" available, so you need to be well formed in the teachings of the Church and your understanding of Scripture, along with allowing the Holy Spirit to guide you as to what kind of seed you need to plant in any given person or situation. Are you planting good seeds? Speaking words of encouragement? Speaking the truth? Sharing your experiences of Jesus and the Church? Preaching the Good News when the opportunity arises? Caring for others? Serving others, etc.?

What kind of "ground" am I? Are my beliefs consistent with the Church's or do I tend to go the "politically correct" views of the day? Am I consistently hopeful and filled with joy, even during difficult circumstances in my life? Do I allow my concerns about the world keep me from being joyful and a witness of the Good News? Do I live a grace filled life in which I fully participate in the life of the Church, regularly receive the Sacraments and pray on a regular basis? My challenge to each of us is to ask our family and friends, what kind of "soil" do they think I am? What kind of "sower" do they think I am? Finally, be careful that you don't step on a seed that someone else planted! Always encourage, while at the same time speak the truth.

## "FRANCISCANS" A EUCHARISTIC ORDER

*From its very beginnings the Franciscan order has been a Eucharistic Order par excellence. It couldn't be otherwise as long as it is faithful to the original charism of its founder, St. Francis of Assisi. The writings of St. Francis are full of references to the Eucharist. Of the 8 letters he wrote that are still in existence, 5 deal with the Holy Eucharist. In his Testament, he again refers to the Eucharist, as well as in his Admonitions. He clearly states why the Eucharist meant so much to him, "...in this world I cannot see the Most High Son of God with my own eyes, except for His Most Holy Body and Blood..."*

*"Every day He humbles Himself just as He did when He came from this heavenly throne into the Virgin's womb;...when He descends from the bosom of the Father into the hands of the priest at the altar."*

## RCIA



**Should our faith change throughout adult life? Most adults say, "Yes."** In Rev. Richard J. Sweeny's Catholic Update article *How God Invites Us to Grow: Six stages of Faith*

*Development* we learn the answers to these questions.

**6. Sacrificial Faith:** Occasionally, history provides us with examples of persons who have so identified with the well-being of others and who are so committed to the values of truth and justice that they have a capacity for selfless love that outreaches most of us. Jesus, Gandhi, Dorothy Day and Archbishop Oscar Romero are examples of this sacrificial faith. Such persons display a radical and consistent commitment to the doing of God's will that is uncompromised by concern for personal status or security. In some cases the willingness to sacrifice self for others has led to martyrdom. For many other less famous persons, it leads to a constant dedication of self to the growth of other persons and the improvement of society as a whole.

Robert Bolt's highly regarded play, *A Man for All Seasons*, presents the political life and death of St. Thomas More and portrays well the features of a truly sacrificial faith. Thomas More resists King Henry VIII's claim to be head of the Church in England and reveals the faith that inspires him with his famous last words, "I die the King's good servant, but God's first." For a person of such faith, following the Will of God, carefully discerned, leaves no room for compromise. One's commitment to values of truth, justice and love becomes all-consuming.

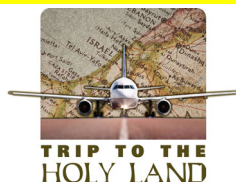
### ST. VINCENT de PAUL
