TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE
"USE HIS BLESSING WELL"

"He will repay every-
one according to his
conduct."
Matthew 16:27

Christ told the disciples that He would be rejected and killed and arise. Peter was shocked at the thought of his leader and model being rejected and killed. "God forbid that this should happen to You", he said. Jesus rebuked him saying, "You are thinking not as God does, but as humans do." Then He reminds Peter that not only will He suffer, but if anyone wishes to follow Him, he or she will also suffer. He goes on to remind Peter of what is important in life. Would it be a great benefit to anyone to own the whole world if he lost his soul in the process? He further admonishes him that the Son of Man will come and reward each one according to his conduct. Jesus was helping Peter to put things in perspective.

What is more important; a collection of things in this world or an eternity of happiness? Of course the answer is obvious. So the question for us is, what do we think more important—having "stuff" or making God important in life? Everyone needs enough of the material things of the world to lead a dignified human life. Work is important in order to make enough money to provide for ourselves and our family. But, when the desire to make more and more money compels us to work extremely long hours so that there is no time for the family, then we should reflect on today's Gospel. How many men have made a great success of their profession or their business by working hard, so hard that their children grew up before they realized that they did not know their children and they did not know him? Work is important and has its place, but if we become obsessed with it then life and family life suffers. May this Gospel be a reminder to help us put things in proper order.

What is important in life? There are many answers to that question. They include providing for the family, using the talents God has given us for our wellbeing and the good of others, doing what God wants us to do, etc. May we look at this issue seriously and make some decisions about what is really important. If it means redirecting our life, then may we have the courage to do that. Let us trust that God will give us whatever we need in life if we use His blessings as we know He would want.

Echoes from the Mountains of Our Sister Diocese in the Dominican Republic Experienced by: Jacob Schlierf

My name is Jacob Schlierf and over this past summer I was blessed to go on a mission trip to our sister diocese with the Our Saviour's Teen Ministry. While there were many experiences which we had that I will treasure, the one that sticks out in my mind happened every morning at 5:00 a.m. in the house I was staying in. A woman named Mariana and her husband took me in and let me live with them for that week. The second night I spent in their house I was woken up a little after 5:00 a.m. to the sound of hushed voices all chanting the same thing in Spanish. I was able to understand after a little bit, that they were saying the Rosary! I was so inspired by this that I asked them if I could possibly join them the next morning if they did it again. Mariana replied that they were indeed going to say the Rosary again at 5:00 a.m. the following morning. So I set my alarm and was able to join them for one of the most beautiful experiences I have ever had while praying the Rosary. I thought about it the entire day and for many days afterwards. I was so surprised to find such dedication, love, and earnest petition all contained in one family. I know for a fact that I have never had the dedication to wake up that early every single day to pray. I have also never lasted more than a month or two saying the Rosary every day, regardless of the time of day that I did it. This family put most families and most people I know to shame with the love they showed our Blessed Mother. Of course the best part of it was that they didn't even realize how extraordinary it was that they were engaged in such a rich and undoubtedly fruitful prayer life. I pray that one day I might receive the conviction that they have in my own prayer life. I know that God is smiling down on this family every single day and that Mary will always have a special place for them in her heart. I hope that one day I might be graced with a family that will be half as dedicated to praying together every day as this family was. It was obvious through their actions that they had a true grasp on what the important things in life are, that they had prioritized them, and God and family came first.

FROM THE DEACON'S DEN



Right after Jesus says he will give Peter the "keys to the Kingdom", Peter demonstrates his weakness and the fact that he does not fully understand who Jesus is, or what Jesus' mission is. Remember last week Peter knew Jesus was the Messiah because God the Father revealed it to him. Like most Jews, it appears that Peter thought the Messiah would be like worldly kings, and enter Jerusalem in a "regal" manner with "pomp and circumstance." (Remember the temptations in Matthew 4!) Jesus comes as a servant king who must die for us and Peter doesn't fully understand this until Pentecost. Jesus makes it clear that his followers must be willing to emulate him by letting Jesus direct their lives and suffer for others. Paul reinforces this and tells us that by doing God's will we make our very lives a prayer! We must think and act as Christ, not as the "World" does; not an easy task. However, Jesus sends us the Holy Spirit and Church to help us think and act as He does. Just as Peter and Paul, we must be willing to make God the most important person in our lives, even to the point of death. It may seem to us that this won't happen in our country, but federal and state governments have become increasingly hostile towards Catholics. The Church's long tradition of social services in helping with adoptions and health care may soon become nonexistent. So, who is **number 1** in your life? (By the way, who is the only apostle to receive a new name from Jesus?)

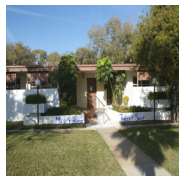

In previous articles, I wrote that we are giving out food at a rate approaching 2,000 lbs. a week to the poor and disadvantaged in our community. This food, which is packed in 40 lb. bags by our pantry staff, is stored in our pantry then loaded in our van for distribution. The food comes from 5 sources: 1) The SVDP Thanksgiving and Easter Food Drives (approx. 30,000 lbs. collected at each food drive); 2) Weekly food donations in the altar and vestibule baskets; 3) Donations from Publix supermarkets; 4) Local post office food drives; 5) Purchasing food from Aldi and similar discount supermarkets.

Last week we had to buy \$2,545 worth of groceries from Aldi's to replenish our pantry. As long as we have the resources, we will continue to provide the basic needs of food to our community. **Food needed for Food Pantry: canned soup, small canned hams, cereal.**

February 27, 2012 - Arrival at Ben Gurion Airport, where you will be met by a local representative and transferred to your 4 Star Hotel. **6:00pm: Orientation and Welcome Dinner!** Overnight in Jerusalem.

February 28, 2012 - Jerusalem - Old City: (B) Drive to Mount of Olives for a panoramic view of the city. Visit the Church of All Nations, King David's Tomb and the Room of the Last Supper on Mount Zion. Enter within the walls of the city and visit the Cardo, Temple Mount (entrance to the mosques not included), Western Wall, Via Dolorosa, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher and the Oriental Bazaar. Visit the Garden Tomb. Overnight in Jerusalem.

February 29, 2012 -(B) Jerusalem – New City and Bethlehem: Drive to **Ein Kerem** to visit the **Church of Visitation**; proceed to **Yad Vashem** Memorial to the Holocaust. Visit the **Israel Museum**, the **Shrine of the Book** which houses the Dead Sea Scrolls and the miniature model of Jerusalem as it was during the Second Temple period. Proceed to **Bethlehem**** to visit the **Church of the Nativity**. Overnight in Jerusalem.

March 1, 2012 - (B) Dead Sea / Massada: Drive to **Qumeran**, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Visit the ancient city of **Qumeran** and drive along the shore of the **Dead Sea**, the lowest place on earth, to **Massada**, the last stronghold of the Jews after the destruction of the Second Temple in 73 A.D. Ascend Massada by cable car and visit the food storeroom, water irrigation system and Herod's Palace. Descend by cable car. Time and weather permitting, an opportunity will be provided to float on the **Dead Sea**. Return to Jerusalem for overnight.

March 2, 2012 -(B) Beit Shean / Nazareth: Depart Jerusalem and drive via the Jordan Valley to **Beit Shean**, a newly excavated city, and visit the **Roman theatre**. Drive to **Yardenit**, the baptismal site on the **Jordan River**, and continue to **Nazareth** via **Cana of Galilee**. In Nazareth, we shall visit the **Church of the Annunciation**, **St. Joseph's Workshop** and **Mary's Well**. Overnight at Kibbutz Lavi.

March 3, 2012 -(B) Tiberias / Capernaum / Banias: After a short tour of **Tiberias**, we take a boat ride to **Capernaum**. Visit the remains of the 2nd century synagogue. Proceed to **Tabgha**, the site of the miracle of fish and loaves, and visit the **Church of Multiplication** with its 4th century mosaic floor. Continue to **Mount of the Beatitudes**, the place where Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount. Drive to the **Banias Springs** and Waterfall and tour the **Golan Heights**. Return to Kibbutz Lavi for dinner and overnight.

March 4, 2012 -(B) Acre / Haifa / Megiddo / Caesarea: Depart Kibbutz Lavi and drive to **Acre** to visit the ancient city and harbor. Continue to **Haifa** to view the Persian Gardens at the **Baha'i Shrine**. Continue to **Megiddo**, identified as the site of Armageddon to visit the archeological excavations, including the well-preserved water supply system. Drive to **Caesarea**, capital of Judea under the Romans. Visit the excavations of the ancient city, Roman theatre and aqueduct. Drive along the coastal plain to **Tel Aviv**. Overnight in Tel Aviv

March 5, 2012 – (B) Day at leisure with late checkout with transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for midnight departure back to MCO.

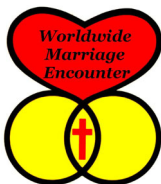
